The author asserts that philanthropy better serves the rich than the poor; most rich people assume their charitable contributions benefit the needy & deserving, when, in fact, most donations end up underwriting activities that are controlled by the upper class.

Burnham calls the IRS the single, most powerful instrument of social control in the U.S. He compares authority vested in a police officer to the authority of IRS agents. He states that any organization with such authority delegated at low levels is subject to abuses and is a prime candidate for poor management.
